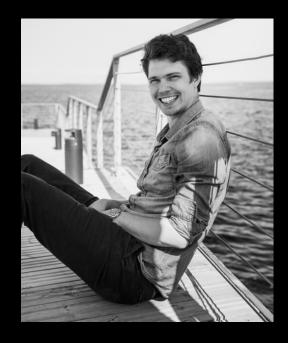

Our Al CTO **Rasmus Toivanen** collected the top three big trends in the Al domain happening right now.

#1 Multimodality revolutionizes video-based Al applications

- Easier to implement methods that involve video monitoring for cases like theft detection and production facility monitoring
- Can integrate multiple modalities like text, image, audio, and video for richer analysis
- Drives innovation in security and industrial automation.

#2 Autonomous Al agents gain tractionHandle complex workflows independ

- Handle complex workflows independently. Various tools and protocols forming (Agent-to-Agent, MCP)
 Deployed in customer service, logistics, workflow automation in general
- Start small, keep tasks simple and then scale.
- #3 Advanced reasoning and specialized models emerge

• New models like OpenAI's ol and Google's Gemini 2.5 achieve human-level

- New models like OpenAl's of and Google's Germini 2.5 achieve numan-level or superhuman reasoning in complex domains such as law, science, and coding
 These models use step-by-step, chain-of-thought processes, improving
